



WALK TO EIGERØY LIGHTHOUSE

ARE YOU READY FOR A TRIP TO THE MOON?

Very few people can travel to the moon, and while the lunar landscape remains a distant dream for most, there exists a place right here on Earth where you can experience a remarkably similar terrain – the Magma UNESCO Global Geopark. The resemblance is especially striking in the vicinity of the Eigerøy Lighthouse.

The light part of the moon consist of anorthosite, which is a rare type of rock here on earth, but is common in the Magma UNESCO Global Geopark. It's a geological marvel that brings the allure of the moon's surface much closer to home.

Eigerøy Lighthouse is the oldest cast iron lighthouse

in Norway and one of the most robust lighthouses across Europe. As you embark on this journey, you'll be treated to a delightful exploration of a breathtaking coastal landscape. On clear days, the scenery is nothing short of magnificent, while stormy days add an exciting edge to the experience.

The walk is easy, beloved by locals and travelers alike, combines the joys of simplicity with the wonders of the natural world.
